

Senate blocks union disclosure Bill C-377

The Canadian Senate has blocked Bill C-377, voting 49-33 to support changes proposed by Conservative Senator Hugh Segal (Kingston-Frontenac-Leeds).

The Senate amendments sent back to the House of Commons raise payment disclosure to \$150,000 from \$5,000 and raise the threshold for salaries to \$444,661. The Senate also amended the bill to exempt unions and union locals with fewer than 50,000 members.
